








English as a Second Language News: Mrs. Salvatore









Library News: Ms. Raimo

Occupational Therapy/Physical Therapy News: Mrs. Davidson, Ms. Graves, Ms. Haystrand, and Mrs. McKenna


In PT and OT, the children worked hard on their gross and fine motor skills. Students completed obstacle courses, used the swing, and practiced their fine motor skills with themed activities.

Speech and Language is in full force addressing the goals and objectives in our students' Individual Educational Plans. Each lesson is adapted to address the student's

needs and abilities. Therapy with our younger students may focus on expanding a student's verbal vocabulary, or sentence length. They are also learning to categorize picture cards and identify colors. Our older students are working to continue developing their vocabulary using more age-appropriate words. They are also working to improve their sentence structure, develop verbal reasoning skills, understand inferences and solve problems.
