




Basic Skills Instruction News: Mrs. Coyle and Ms. Guider

The BSI students have been working hard in Language Arts. Kindergarten through Second grade have been focusing on different aspects of phonics; beginning and ending sounds, long vowel sounds, and the magic e rule. Third through Sixth graders have been working on story elements, identifying the author's purpose, sequencing events in the story, and comprehension skills. 
Enrichment/Gifted and Talented News: Mrs. Morris

It sure has been a busy month in Enrichment! The Kindergarten and First grade enjoyed Halloween STEM Lessons, building a haunted house to trap a ghost. Working in groups, the students used Unifix cubes and Legos to build their houses. Working as a team was a central focus in this lesson. It will continue to be a focus in Enrichment this year, as it is a major challenge and important skill. The students also enjoyed hearing a

story about the changing leaves, matched leaves to types of trees, and created leaf rubbings. The Second graders completed their lggy Peck unit. After groups completed their bridge challenge, we went onto learn about 2D and 3D structures, creating them with toothpicks and marshmallows. The Third and Fourth grades continued to work on the engineering design process. They learned about simple machines, and designed and built pumpkin pulley systems. The Fourth graders designed and built awesome marble maze runs. They were tasked with keeping their




marbles running for a minimum of 10 seconds. The Fifth graders are completing their "Who Stole the Chocolate?" unit. During this forensic science investigation, the students completed labs analyzing fingerprints, footprints, white powder, soil, bite marks, and chromatography. The students did a great job collaborating to design and build bridges that will hold a set amount of pennies, marbles, and bananas!




Library News: Ms. Raimo






Occupational Therapy/Physical Therapy News: Mrs. Davidson, Ms. Graves, Ms. Haystrand, and Mrs. McKenna
