Associative Property of Multiplication- The property that states that when the grouping of factors is changed, the product remains the same.
Distributive Property- The property that states that multiplying a sum by a number is the same as multiplying each addend by the number and then adding the products. Multiple- A number that is the product of two counting numbers.
