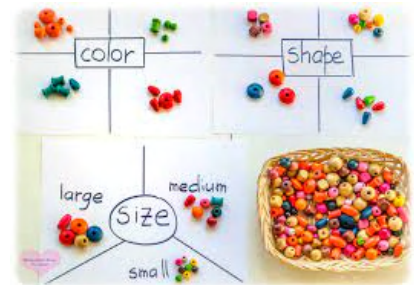

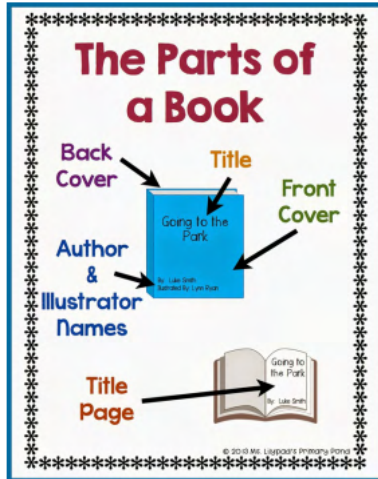

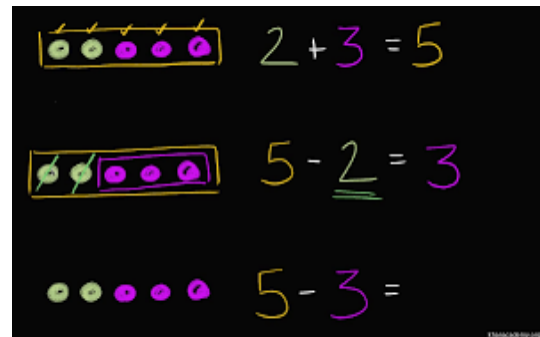

Happy Fall! In Reading, we have been learning about the parts of a book. We have learned what a title means, as well as

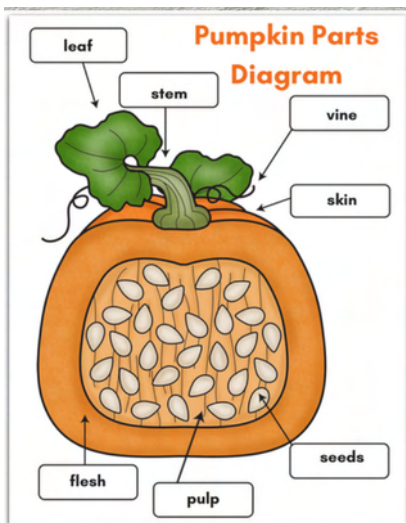


what an author and illustrator do. In Math, we are working on addition and subtraction facts within 10. Doubles facts are our favorite! In

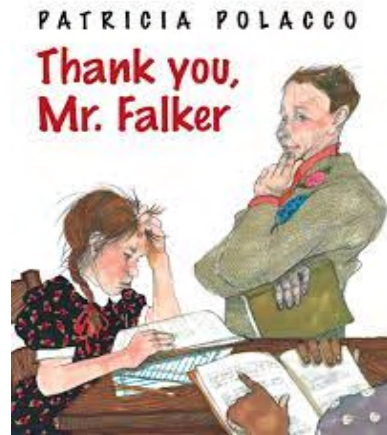
excited about participating in Halloween related activities! Please remember to make sure Chromebooks are charged each night. Enjoy the weekend!
