We are learning and singing about our families, Thanksgiving, Veterans Day, and fall. The children continue to learn the letters, Ee and Ff, and



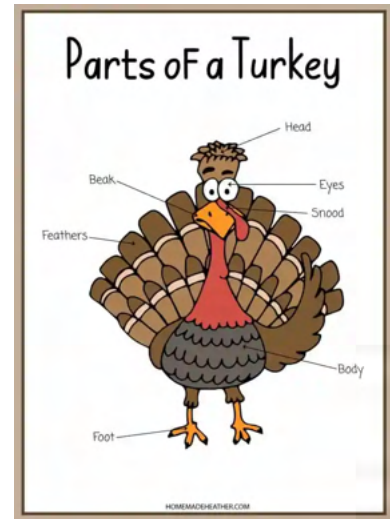

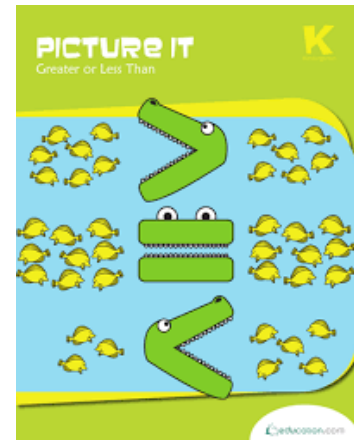

I am thankful for...

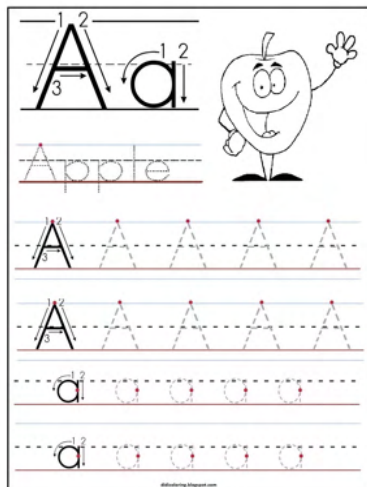

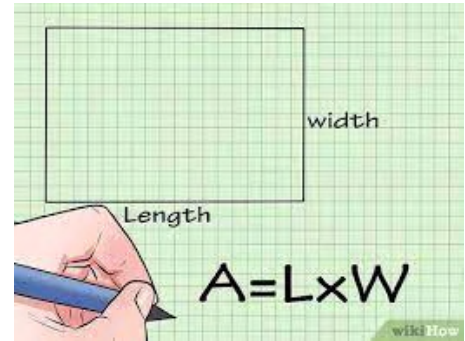

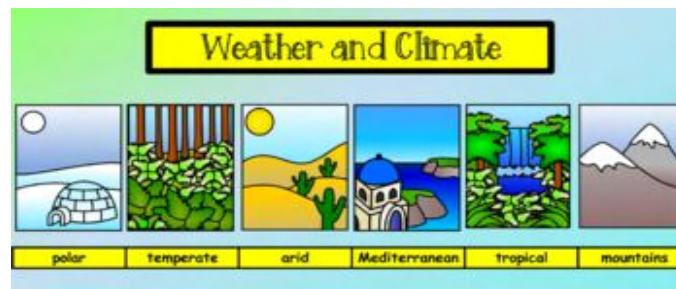

In Math, your child is learning about area. In addition to learning about the area of simple rectangular shapes, he or she will also learn how to find the area of irregular shapes. Your child will use both nonstandard and standard units to calculate the area with and without grid paper.



In Science, weather and climate instruments are all the rage. They have acquired knowledge of weather patterns, weather graphs, and weather charts. They will also learn about forecasting the weather based on patterns.
