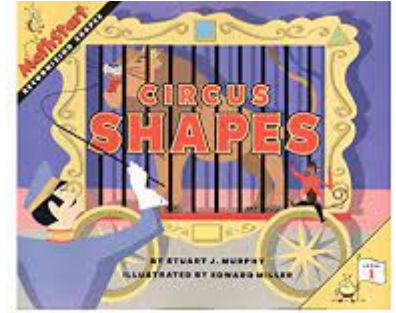


## Ms. Bennett

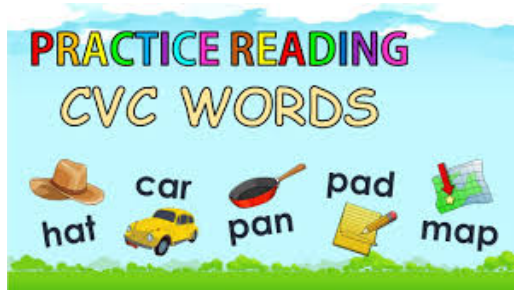

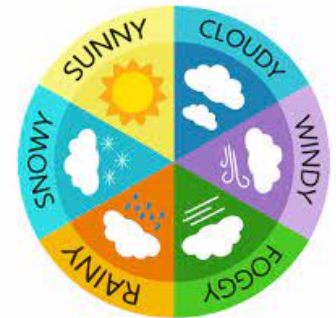


## Ms. Lane and Ms. Sinclair

toys to make patterns! We continue to learn new word families, and sight words in Reading. Room 101 is full of hard workers!



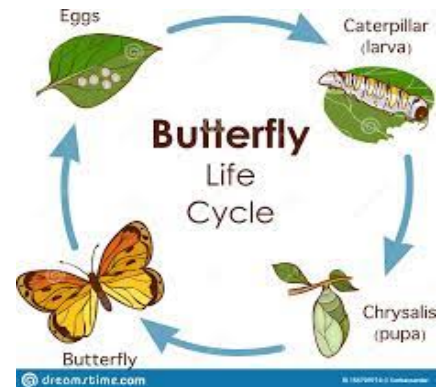
## Mrs. Davis, Ms. Rapp, and Ms. Jackson

comparing numbers. In Science, we will begin learning about the life cycle of a butterfly. Please continue reading, and practicing your sight words and math facts.





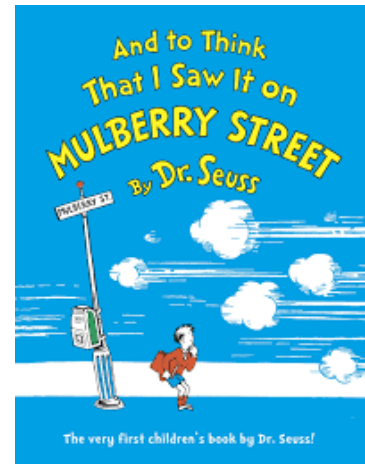


## Mrs. Capazzi

Second Grade school spirit thrived in recent celebrations, which included Read Across America, bringing fun and unique opportunities to embrace reading and learning in many ways. Special guest readers, themed days, a Magic of Reading assembly, and exciting contests made our week extra special! Moving forward in both reading and writing, non-fiction will continue to be a

focus. Opinions are stirring much conversation in writing, where children are explaining their opinions with reasoning and details. Math has focused around place value, comparing numbers, and skip counting. Students are further developing their understanding of numbers with digits in the hundreds, tens, and ones.

Upcoming Math chapters will focus on three digit addition, and subtraction with regrouping. In our new Science unit, Energy in Motion, we are exploring force, motion, and sound. In this unit we are experimenting in many ways! Students are investigating pushes, pulls, sinking,

floating, and magnets. Students will work on ways to measure motion, and recognize key components of sound! Exciting themes and interactive class lessons capture the true joy of learning in Second Grade!





## Mrs. Cruz Betesh and Mrs. Houston

In Math, the Third Grade is learning strategies to add and subtract numbers using mental math. One strategy for solving addition problems, using mental math, is to break apart numbers to make a ten, because the ten is easier to add. Here's an example:

Find  $157 + 34$ .

You can make a 10 by adding 3 to 157.

$$157 + 3 = 160$$

Break apart 34 into  $3 + 31$ .

$$160 + 31 = 191$$

So,  $157 + 34 = 191$ .

For subtraction, you can use the same strategy of making a ten.

Find  $378 - 195$ .

It is easier to subtract 200.

$$378 - 200 = 178$$

If you subtract 200, you subtract 5 more than 195.

You must add 5 to the answer.

$$178 + 5 = 183$$

So,  $378 - 195 = 183$ .



Help your child practice using mental math to add and subtract.



In Social Studies, we are learning about amazing women, to celebrate Women's History Month. Ask your child which incredible woman is their favorite, and why?

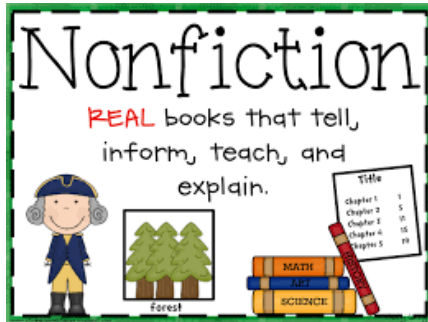
