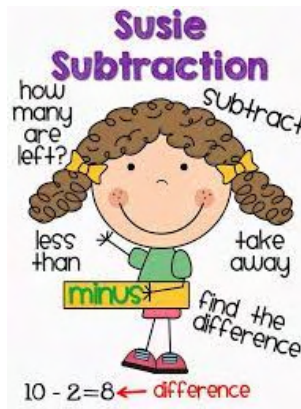
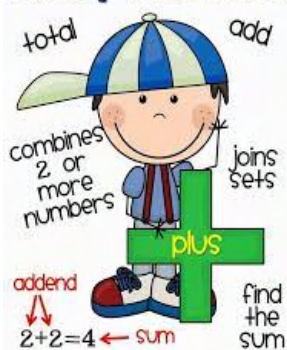


Ms. Lane and Ms. Sinclair

The amount of time that passes between one time and another.

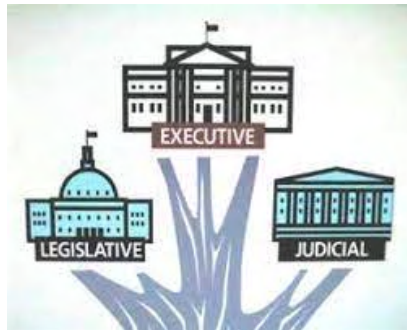
