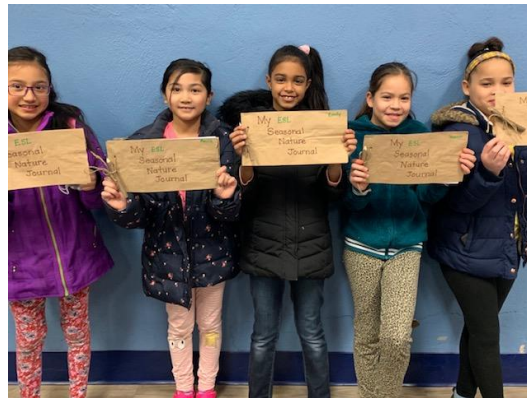
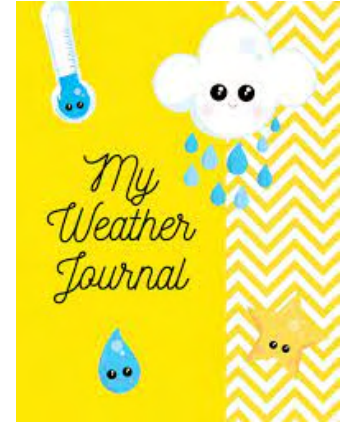


Mrs. Salvatore
