



school, and making new friends. The Kindergarten has been working hard on learning our school and classroom rules, creating amazing self portraits and name projects,


and learning how to collaborate and work together in small groups. We can't wait to see what exciting experiences this year brings!











Welcome students and families to an exciting and fun filled school year. This year, in Second Grade, the children will be challenged to learn and grow through interactive and engaging lessons. Activities will spark imagination and creativity throughout the year. As the students begin settling into classroom routines and

procedures, they will be working in Literacy Centers, Science Centers, Math

Centers, peer groups, and whole class discussion. In Math, we have been discussing initial number concepts including even, odd, and place value. Moving forward, instruction will focus on counting patterns, and operations in base ten. Students are encouraged to practice math facts daily, to strengthen fact recall. Readers and Writers Workshop will continue with





practice, both independently and in focus groups. Children will be writing daily, completing published projects, and journals. Over the next few weeks, we will be focusing on journal writing, and helpful tools to write long and strong. We have reviewed, and will continue to practice, the writing process including pre-writing, drafting, revising, editing, and publishing. We will be learning additional reading strategies and tips, identifying the setting and main characters of a story, along with summarizing a story, sequence, and making predictions. Students are encouraged

to read "long and strong" each day as part of their daily routine, and at home each evening. Students will be introduced to critical Social Studies concepts of teamwork, classroom rules, and communities. They will be encouraged to practice leadership skills with classroom jobs, and be engaged through hands-on learning activities. 









children have been working on reading, and making and writing numbers 0 to 5, while others are working on understanding addition and


Dear Family,

Your child is learning how to multiply. Help him or her

think of multiplication as joining equal groups. For example, 5×2 is 5 groups of 2. So, $5 \times 2 =$ 10.

Your child is also learning how to divide. Help him or her think of division as

sharing equally. For example, 42÷7 can be thought of as 42 crayons and 7 boxes. Each box has an equal number of crayons. There are 6 crayons in each box.




