

identifying letters, sounds, and how to write



In the coming weeks, we will continue to work on strengthening Reading skills, including summarizing a story,



visualizing, and making inferences using details from each book. Furthermore, we will assist the students in different types of writing strategies, in which students will begin to expand their knowledge in journal writing and

narrative-focused pieces. Moreover, each child will have the unique opportunity to choose a narrative to build upon, expand, edit, and publish.

In Math, we will be completing Topic 2, which focused on even and odd numbers, as well as making arrays. Topic 3 will have a major focus on addition within 100, where all the students will be learning the different strategies that can be used.

We have completed our initial Social Studies concepts on people and communities, and have moved into Science instruction of seasons and weather. The students are very excited to be working on several



projects involving an all time favorite, the Water Cycle, as well as an opportunity for each student to



showcase their art skills in creating seasonal posters. As the seasons continue to change, we look forward to watching the new weather come in, the pretty fall leaves come down, and we even have an experiment planned where we research rainfall! 
