


December is here! With the colder weather approaching, we have been learning all about winter weather, and the clothes we wear to



Dear Third Grade Family,

As we begin Topic 4: Use Multiplication to Divide, your child is using fact families to learn division facts. A fact family has one or two multiplication facts, and one or two division facts that use the same three numbers. For example, below is the fact family for 5, 9, and 45.

FACT FAMILY
$$5 \times 9 = 45$$
 $45 \div 9 = 5$
 $45 \div 5 = 9$

Three numbers $2 \times 3 = 6$
that create two multiplication and $3 \times 2 = 6$
two division problems $6 \div 2 = 3$
 $6 \div 3 = 2$

Your child should continue to practice multiplication facts each night. Here's a website they can use to practice: https://www.timestables.com.
