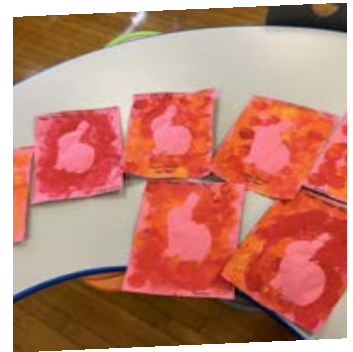

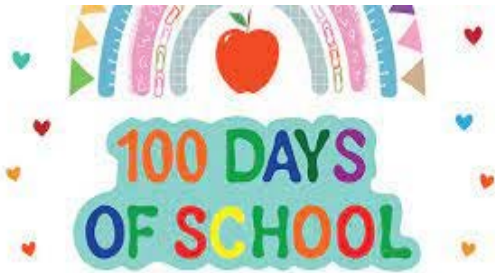

two digit numbers. All students have recently participated in units on forces and energy. Have a great weekend!



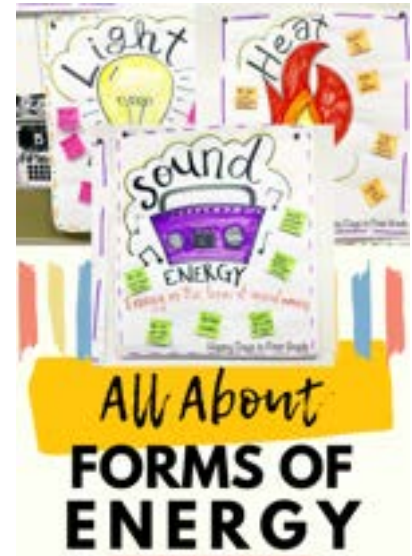

In recent weeks, our Second Graders have been hard at work reading nonfiction text, developing their “All About Me” writing projects, enjoying guest presentations from our High School students, and interacting in a Hip Hop Assembly! In ELA, students are reading weekly nonfiction readers and identifying key vocabulary, features of nonfiction text, author's purpose, and main ideas. Students continue to practice the writing process, which includes drafting, editing, revising, and publishing. Qualities of good writing have been a focus, including content (focus on one topic/idea), elaboration (details),



structure, and voice (author's personality). We have moved on from our habitat unit and are now focusing on landforms and map skills. Students have completed topic six in Math, which focused on fluently subtracting within 100. In the next topic, we will continue to add and subtract, using addition and subtraction within 100, to solve one and two-step word



problems. These problems will involve situations of adding to, taking from, putting together, taking apart, and comparing with unknowns in all positions. We are so proud of our Second Graders and are excited for many adventures ahead!

The Third Grade is having fun with weather patterns. Did you know that when it gets too cold in Florida, iguanas fall off trees?
