




Ms. Bartnicki, Ms. Garcia, and Ms. Husti



Spring has finally arrived! The Second Graders welcomed the new season with a creative hallway display, showcasing their understanding of recent math concepts including addition and subtraction with regrouping, money, and time! Students worked together in small groups to plan and develop unique examples of each skill to solve and present. We will be moving forward with three-digit addition and subtraction. Please continue to work on regrouping at home to strengthen mastery. Moving forward in Literacy, students will be transitioning from



nonfiction text to character studies, identifying main characters, character traits, and character feelings. Students will be able to infer and develop connections with characters. Students will also work on identifying what characters are doing, how characters are feeling, why characters feel certain ways, and how those feelings change throughout a story. Opinions are stirring much conversation in Writing, where children will be describing their opinions while providing reasons, explanations, and details. Economics is our new theme in Science/Social Studies, where students are learning about making, selling, and the purchasing of goods and services. We will also compare the topics of needs vs. wants, consumer vs. producer, and economic choice (spending vs. saving). Much excitement lies ahead in Second Grade!





The Third Graders have been busy researching black Americans and amazing women this winter. We started out reading about famous figures in slavery, like Harriet Tubman and Sojourner Truth. We learned about The Underground Railroad and designed our own freedom quilts. Students then continued talking about The Civil Rights Movement and amazing people like Martin



Luther King, Jr. and Ruby Bridges, as well as Rosa Parks. We are now researching, writing, and illustrating biographies of famous women in honor of Women's History Month. In Writing, we are working on figurative language. We illustrated idioms, similes, and onomatopoeia. We also discussed hyperbole, personification, and metaphors. To use alliteration: Several students studied significant subjects in Science and Social Studies this semester.
