





Being able to






We have been getting ready for spring and Earth Day! We have been making some spring crafts using dot art and some paint


warmer weather and can't wait to take some of our sessions outside!

This week, 4th Graders are working on reading comprehension skills. They are reading short books, articles, and dialogue conversations. At the end of the assignments, students complete question and answer activities, multiple choice answers, answer questions, cut and paste vocabulary, have conversations in Spanish, express opinions and thoughts about the readings, etc. 5th and 6th Graders are working on a



Spanish Speaking Country project. First, the 5th Graders learned the geography of Latin American countries, the countries names, the capitals, and the



culture. The 6th Graders went to a Hispanic Flamenco Ballet show in Jersey City. At this time, both grades are gaining further knowledge of Latin American Countries by completing a project that includes cultural aspects, such as food, music, famous people, flags, dance, songs, festivals, etc. In addition to the above activities, students play ball activities, take quizzes, play games on various websites, read cultural articles, sing songs, watch fun videos, have meaningful conversations, do presentations, learn grammar, and enjoy the class.
