



April has been a busy and exciting month! We have learned all about weather in Science. It was a lot of fun learning about different types of clouds and the weather




they bring! Our Reading and Math skills have been growing every day, and we continue to make progress with all our




Second Grade has been filled with adventure. Several lessons and projects brought the opportunity to explore, investigate, and experiment! We are wrapping up our dinosaur unit with diorama presentations. In addition to our

dinosaur unit, the Second
Graders have been observing
the life cycle of butterflies!
Currently, our butterflies are in
their chrysalis transition phase.
In Math, the students are
working on three digit addition
and subtraction. They are

expected to solve problems using various methods that include using an open number line, models, place value, and partial sums. In Literacy, we have moved on to character studies, identifying main characters, character traits, and character feelings. Students have also been making predictions, inferencing, and drawing connections. Understanding what characters are doing, how characters are



of measurement for capacity and mass. In addition, your children are learning how to



solve problems that involve adding and subtracting time intervals using pictorial models and tools, to build understanding of elapsed time. Use the following activity to enhance your child's understanding of time and elapsed time:

What Time Is It?

Materials: Clock face and number lines.

- Ask your child what time it is right now. Repeat throughout the day for various events, such as the time for breakfast, lunch, and dinner. You may also want to have your child decide on the events for which he or she will record the time.
- Ask your child what time it will be in 30 minutes, 45 minutes, or 60 minutes from a given time. For example, you may tell your child that the family needs to be at the park 45 minutes from the given time. Then ask your child to tell you the time it will be.
- Help your child write and follow a schedule for eating dinner, doing homework, and getting ready for bed. Talk about the length of each activity.
