

Instrumental lessons are canceled due to testing. After testing, lessons will be optional, as per the lesson schedules.









sounds and auditory comprehension to expand our receptive and expressive language skills in the classroom. Keep up the great work!

In Physical Education classes, students have started to revisit some of their favorite activities from throughout the year. The older students used their football throwing and catching skills to participate in "Football Frenzy," while younger students used their throwing skills to play "Save the Earth." First Grade students also demonstrated their spelling skills and letter recognition by participating in a game of

"Locomotor Go-Fish." Students had to perform the locomotor movement of their station to the middle of the floor to pick a card, then

perform the movement on the way back. If the letter on their card matches a letter in their "locomotor word" they keep the card until they spell out the whole word!

Our Health classes learned about "Growth Mindset," and how to think positively about themselves and to never give up! Integrating the word "yet" into their vocabulary can be




very helpful. For example, "I can't do long division, YET!" Adding this word to the end of a sentence indicates that a person is willing and able to learn a new skill. This was a great lesson to visit, especially during state testing time!

Mrs Salvatore's classes have been learning about plants. We just finished a unit on "Plants We Eat" and "Why Leaves Change Color." The students learned about photosynthesis, chlorophyll,



in Enrichment and Gifted and Talented classes. Kindergarten through Second Grade have been participating in Fairytale STEM. Kindergarten and First Grade students heard Goldilocks and The Three Bears, adapted by Maya Alperin, and used this story to explore SEL and STEM activities. Kindergarten students built Goldilocks her own chair, while First Graders designed and built Goldilocks a bed of her own! Grade 2 students worked on problem solving and have begun their own fairytale STEM unit,



"Hansel and Gretel Trap the Witch." In

this unit, students collaborate to design and build traps that



Hansel and Gretel can escape, but the larger witch cannot! Grade 3 students continue building models of Tiny Houses! In the process, we are studying geometry, area, and perimeter. These houses are coming out so cool! Grade 4 students have completed their original learning board games, and we are now playing them in class! Grade 5 and 6 G & T students have been enjoying exploring the Strawbees building



system. Currently, Grade 5 students are using them to design and build bridges, and Grade 6 students are designing and building catapults, to see who can project an object the farthest!


Kindergarten and First Grade students practiced, then mastered, the art of how to draw a chameleon grasping onto a branch. They then experimented with "mixing" crayons of the primary colors of red, yellow and blue to create secondary colors of



orange, green and purple. They are looking forward to redrawing their chameleons on good paper and mixing oil pastels for their final project in this lesson.

Students from Mr. Alkhazov's class, Mrs. Husti's class, Ms. Lane's class and Mrs. Bush's class printed cards for their moms for Mother's Day. They printed Andy Warhol-inspired Mickey

Mouse and Snoopy images for their cards using recycled styrofoam plates with engraved designs on them. The plates were "inked" using paint sticks. The students enjoyed



Grades 2-4 were introduced to the bold and colorfully patterned art of Romero Britto. After viewing a video about Britto and his work, the students practiced emulating his style. They





learned how to draw a Romero Britto-inspired dog, and how to use Britto's established patterns to color their unique creations.

Students in Grades 5 and 6 learned about the history of the

self-portrait/photo selfie. After watching a video on the subject, the students then practiced pencil sketches of head and shoulder portraits following the guidelines for correct facial proportions. Once they master the technique of using facial proportion guidelines, the students will create their own color selfie on a phone template for the final project in this lesson. As June approaches, Lincoln School students put artistic exclamation points to their school year.
