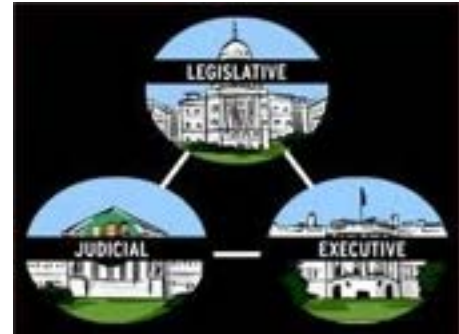

In Math, students are learning about place value relationships. We've moved up to the next

level of rounding and comparing numbers by jumping up to the thousands and millions periods. Make sure students are always practicing their basic multiplication facts, at home, with tools such as flash cards and IXL.



In Science, we are learning about the different types of energy in the world. We're doing lab experiments to observe how energy is transferred and transformed when objects collide.

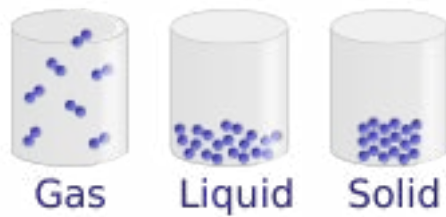


In Math, the Sixth Grade has learned how to find the least common multiples and the greatest common factors. Students learned that there are many divisibility tricks that are useful ways of determining whether a given number is divisible by another number. They also learned how to divide multi-digit numbers and multiply fractions by turning

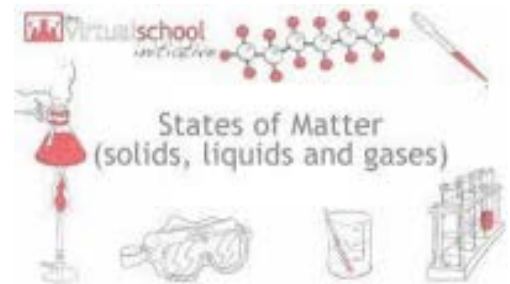


a mixed number into an improper fraction. Students have been working very hard to master these concepts and apply them. I encourage them to continue practicing their Math facts to help with a quick recall.

In Science class, the Sixth Grade students are identifying how matter is measured through weight, mass, volume, and density. The students are recognizing how



changes in matter are related to changes in energy, and the difference between a physical change and chemical change.



The Sixth Grade students have been working collaboratively on group presentations for the Week of Respect in October. Under the guidance of Mrs. Alkin, they have been planning and creating fun lessons and activities for the younger students. The students have been



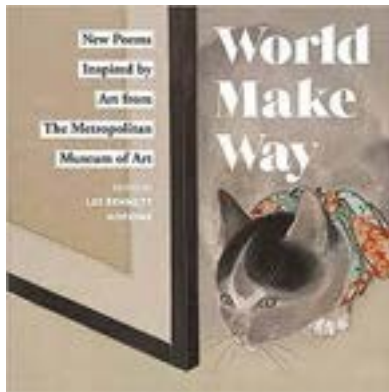
working very hard and preparing for their presentations. We can't wait to see the final products!



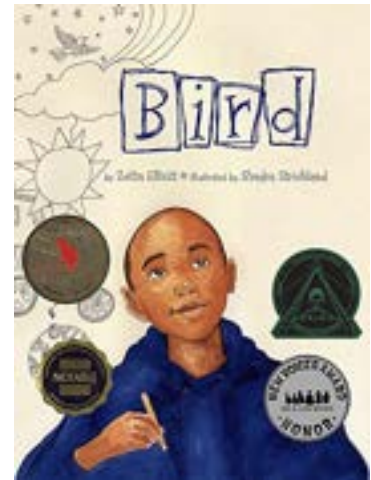

It was great to meet so many of you at Back to School Night! The Sixth Grade jumped right into their first writing piece. After creating a heart map, the students learned how to draw on their personal experiences and use those experiences as inspiration for their fictional narratives. This week, the students began developing their main character using a T-chart. They focused



on developing believable characters by giving them flaws. The students also worked on developing one descriptive scene for their essay that shows a need for their character. Soon they will be organizing essays with a story mountain. The focus on grammar has been understanding complete sentences, with proper punctuation, as well as identifying the complete subject and complete predicate.



In Reading, we have established classroom norms and expectations that we will follow during our guided reading groups. We also read some very interesting interactive read-alouds focusing on the themes of “Kindness and Compassion,” “Handling Emotions,” and “Inspiration and Creativity.” As a class, we have been focusing on digging deep and understanding the messages of these stories. Students are then given a prompt and respond to each book in their reading binder. For word work, we have been focusing on the prefixes re, mis, and pre. We’re developing a deeper understanding of how these prefixes alter the meaning of root words, and how that can help us better understand unfamiliar words in context. The Sixth Graders are doing a great job getting used to new class expectations. Please remember to read for 30 minutes every night!

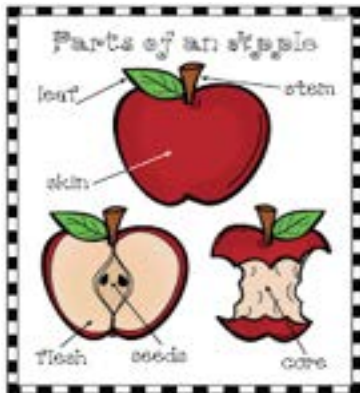
