

The state mandates that all ESL students must take the NJ ACCESS test. Each ESL student must take







making paper, and they are creating collages to commemorate the Year of the Dragon. Fourth Grade G&T students continue to design










of expression and a wide range of interpretation. They will then present their stories to our group. Finally, the Sixth Grade G&T students continue studying mythical creatures.



This past month in Speech, we have been using holiday themed activities to target our students' goals. Our students enjoyed learning about Valentine's Day, President's Day, Black History month, and the 100th Day of School. Our Preschool and younger students have been using Valentine's Day themed sensory bins



to target using longer sentences, requesting objects, following directions, using correct pronouns, having conversations, describing and taking turns. Our older students have been using books to work on reading comprehension, increasing vocabulary, problem solving,



answering WH questions, sequencing, describing, and working on their speech sounds. Two books our students enjoyed reading this month were There Was an Old Lady Who Swallowed a Rose and

Duck For President. We look forward to continuing to work on increasing our student's speech and language abilities!

During the younger Physical Education classes, students participated in activities that focused on improving cardiovascular endurance while following sets of directions. During "Bumper Cars," students used their feet to move hula hoops around the gym and follow instructions on who/what color(s) was "It." During "Hula Hoops Squeeze," numerous hula hoops were spread around the gym floor. Students would move around the gym using locomotor movements such as skipping, galloping, hopping, etc. Then on a prompt, students would have to correctly move the appropriate hula hoops. One example was "I need the answer to 4-2=? in each hula hoop!" Students would then have to get two

students in a hula hoop as quickly as

possible. The older students have been learning the basic skills of Volleyball such as the bump, set, serve, and dig by participating in small groups to do their best to keep the ball in the air. Beach Ball V-Ball saw the students using these skills to battle an opponent and try to score points as you would in Volleyball, however the courts in this game were the folding mats. Students had to try to hit the ball over the net and have the beach ball land on the mat in order to score a point.





Basic skills continues to work on reading comprehension and reading strategies in order to help develop students skills. Multisensory instruction is a way of teaching that engages more than one sense at a time. Using sight, hearing, movement, and touch will help your child develop their reading skills. In ELA, students are writing comparisons and opinions. We are learning about prepositions, adverbs, and subject/verb agreement. We are examining examples of onomatopoeia and personification. Check out the ELA Video Library on Google Classroom for



educational songs and tutorials regarding this month's grammar topics. The Second and



Third Graders have been working hard on reading and spelling their sight words. Parents, to see your child's sight word progress, log onto Google Classroom. Look for the Digital Sight Word Flashcards. Each flashcard is color-coded based on if the student has read and spelled the word correctly. Our ELA Resource has an exciting homework incentive for Trimesters 2 & 3. Students in Grades 2-6 are working to earn 100 Homework Credits from the ELA Homework Credit Menu, found on Google Classroom. Homework assignments



include a Free Writing Journal, Music Review, Food Review, and IXL practice. Students who earn 100 Homework Credits will earn a \$5 Dunkin Donuts gift card. Several students are leading the pack with 35+ homework credits. Well done!

The students have been working hard in Math. Our 2nd Graders are practicing their basic addition and subtraction facts as well as regrouping. They are also working on time and



money. Have them practice at home so they can show what they have learned. We are doing many different activities to master this concept. Our Third Graders are mastering their multiplication and division facts. We are practicing by using IXL and other fun worksheets. The students in 5th Grade are working on multiplying multi digit whole numbers and decimals. They are beginning long division as well as working on solving

word problems. The 6th Graders are working on ratios and writing and solving equations.
